What will my child be learning this term?

The topics for this term for Nursery are listed below. We have also included a few suggestions as to how you can help your child at home.

Reminders

The school day starts at **8.50** and ends at **3.00**.

📖 School uniform must include sensible black shoes and **not trainers**.

We will be learning how to look after ourselves and our friends.</p> <p>Encourage your child to share and wait for their turn when playing with other children.</p>
<p>Communication, Language and Literacy</p>	<p>Growing</p> <p>The Very Hungry Caterpillar</p> <p>Billy and Belle</p> <p>Owl Babies</p>	<p>We will be re-telling the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar thinking about what comes first, next and last. We are beginning to use story book language when talking about our stories.</p> <p>When reading with your child, talk about what is happening in the story, who are the characters and what they like or dislike about the story. Encourage your child to tell you the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar.</p>
<p>Problem Solving, Reasoning and Numeracy</p>	<p>Calculating</p> <p>Shapes, patterns and measuring</p>	<p>We will be learning to count objects, talking about more, less and the same.</p> <p>We will be looking at shapes and patterns in the environment. We will be measuring and comparing the height of ourselves and our plants.</p> <p>You can help at home by helping your child to count objects in practical situations, e.g. setting the table or when out shopping. Also encourage your child to think of ways measuring size, time and capacity. For example when cooking, shopping for clothes and at the park.</p>
